General Site Layout

The Arena's will be minimum size 100m x 50m. There will be a scurry competitor's compound, for the parking of Horseboxes, equipment etc. The area will be provided with chemical re-circulating toilets and water supply.

Rules

The Living Heritage Championship is to be run under The Scurry Driving Association Rules 2009 Owners, drivers and sponsors must be members of the Scurry Driving Association. Ponies must be registered with the Association. Ponies must be 4 years old or over and be driven to a suitable 4 wheeled vehicle with a working brake.

All vehicles must have a standard track width of 130cm or more and may be measured on leaving the ring after the completion of the round. Competitors whose vehicle does not measure 130cm or more will be disqualified.
